SILKE COMMUNICATIONS ACQUIRES STRATEGIC COMMUNICATIONS FACILITIES ON BUCK MOUNTAIN

Eugene— Silke Communications, a western Oregon provider of wireless radio solutions and communication tower services and spectrum, has acquired a full-service, developed communications facility that includes a 140-foot communications tower on Buck Mountain, near Mt. Tom. Like Silke's other facilities, Buck Mountain is secured and features power, power back-up and telco.

The purchase will serve Silke's customers by expanding the coverage area for wireless radio and pager users, and offering spectrum customers access to a previously unavailable full-service facility.

"Buck's location made it very desirable," says President Jim Silke. "We anticipate greater demand in the southern Willamette Valley, both from our wireless customers, and from the national providers who use our spectrum. That position at the eastern edge of the valley helps with coverage along the I-5 corridor, and lets us reach significantly deeper into the Cascades."

The Buck transaction was a cash sale; the amount of the sale is undisclosed.

Silke owns or manages approximately 25 communications facilities in western Oregon. A full list and map are available at silkecom.com/towers.

Silke Communications is a family-owned company, with a record of service and innovation that reaches back to 1964 when it built its first tower. The company offers a full menu of communications services, from tower leases to radio communications sales and installation.
