NEW COMMUNICATIONS FACILITY NEAR NEWPORT, OREGON TO ALLOW FOR IMPROVED CELLULAR, RADIO AND MICROWAVE SERVICES TO CENTRAL COAST

Eugene – Silke Communications has completed the siting, design, engineering and construction of a new, state-of-the-art, full-scale communications facility located at Cape Foulweather near Otter Crest, Oregon – close to the busy fishing port and picturesque tourism hub of Newport, Oregon.

The site features a 150-foot self-supporting tower with a facility that houses equipment, including a back-up generator, security system and surveillance, and supporting equipment. It is ready for cellular, radio and microwave equipment. The tower already hosts equipment for Silke’s digital radio network, FleetNet™. Likely users for the site include public safety agencies and national cell carriers.

The Otter Crest tower is located at 44-45-22.45 latitude and 124-02-56.33 longitude at an elevation of 331 meters.
